Fences for Fido builds free, secure play yards for families living in transitional housing and domestic violence shelters—ensuring that pets have a safe place to run and play while staying together with the people who love them.

By removing barriers to pet companionship during times of crisis, we help keep families whole, support healing, and give both people and pets the freedom and comfort they deserve.









For many families, even the most basic needs can feel out of reach — limited income, rural locations, health challenges, or lack of transportation can make it difficult to access food, veterinary care, or other essential services for their pets. When resources are scarce, pets can go underfed, unvaccinated, and unaltered — leading to preventable illness and disease and unplanned litters.

Families who love their animals deeply often face heartbreaking choices as they struggle to care for ever-growing numbers of pets.

When families have nowhere else to turn, **Fences For Fido is that lifeline**, providing life-saving
emergency veterinary care and much-needed relief
from pain.

Routine Spay & Neuter



The crisis that began during the pandemic continues to impact both people and animals. Shelters and rescues remain at capacity, housing insecurity is rising, and veterinary costs have increased nearly 40% in the last few years.

In response, Fences For Fido has funded 3,500 veterinary services across the communities we serve.

Every dog we unchain is spayed or neutered and receives essential wellness care — often their first-ever vet visit — **helping ensure they live happy, healthy lives with families who cherish them.**





Rural Clinics & Support



In partnership with Madras Animal Hospital, Fences For Fido holds free vaccine and wellness clinics and year-round spay and neuter services for families on the Warm Springs Reservation. Here, Fences For Fido is the only nonprofit organization approved by the Tribal Council to provide services for dogs and cats.

During our clinics, dogs receive vaccines to protect against rabies, parvovirus, and distemper, as well as treatments for fleas and ticks, and deworming. Cats receive vaccines for rabies and RVRCP, as well as treatment for fleas and ticks, and deworming.

A Reflection from the Field

When we build a fence, we often step into the lives of families facing serious challenges. Each fence reveals the growing inequities in access to pet care across Oregon and beyond.



The fence itself is just the beginning. It opens the door for us to provide other essential support — vaccines, spay/neuter services, food, supplies — and, most importantly, the chance to listen.

Our work brings us into the lives and yards of our most vulnerable neighbors. What we've learned is that **chaining is rarely a first choice** — **it's a last resort.** Behind every dog on a chain, and every family struggling to access care, is a story of someone doing their best with what they have.

Our circle of care extends beyond fences to include doghouses, monthly pet food, veterinary services, and supplies — giving pets the chance to live longer, healthier lives with the families who love them.

We see the systems that are failing families who want nothing more than to keep their pets safe and cared for. Fences For Fido stands as a prevention partner, offering community-driven solutions and a lifeline that keep pets and people together — where love meets need.

The Bingen 6: Where Love Meets Need—In Action



When Brittany reached out from rural Bingen, Washington, her message was simple: "We've been trying to build a fence for a year. We just don't have the tools or knowledge. Please help."

She and her partner were living in a camper without water, power, or transportation. Outside, six pit bulls — her family — were chained day after day.

Our team built two safe, roomy yards so every dog could finally run free. We delivered doghouses, shade, and water through the summer heat, transported all six dogs for spay/neuter, and now provide monthly food to help keep everyone healthy.

When we learned Brittany walked an hour each way to work, we found her a bike — because caring for her dogs starts with caring for her, too. Could she give up the dogs? Maybe. But where would they go? Shelters are full. Bully breeds have few options. They are family — and deeply loved.
